Practice Overview

Marie Louise has a specialist practice, focusing on private international law and EU law. She acts as specialist counsel on jurisdiction, choice of law and related issues in a wide variety of claims including commercial law, environmental law, human rights, product liability and personal injury. Recent work includes acting for the Claimants in the Supreme Court in *Vedanta*, a jurisdiction dispute in a group environmental claim concerning copper mining in Zambia, and acting for the Foreign and Commonwealth Office in the Kenyan Emergency group litigation, a claim by 42,000 Kenyans arising out of the Mau Mau uprising in the 1950s.

She has a particular reputation for appellate work involving novel points of law. In the last few years she has appeared in 5 cases in the Supreme Court on important issues of private international law and regularly appears in the Court of Appeal. She has particular expertise on Rome I and II as well as the application of foreign law by English courts.

Apart from her career in Chambers, Marie Louise has taught EU law at Cambridge University and she is frequently invited to lecture in this country and abroad. She is recognised in the legal directories for her conflict of laws and EU law expertise and is recommended in EU, Travel, Insurance & Reinsurance and personal injury.
